

MAGEE MARSH WILDLIFE AREA



Magee Marsh is a habitat for wetland wildlife species. When visiting the marshes, there is a chance to see various types of ducks, geese, bald eagles, osprey, owls, turtles, muskrats, beavers, foxes, otters, deer, and a large variety of songbirds. Many of these birds migrate through, making it a great place to go bird watching in the fall and spring months. This park also offers accessible trails and a newly renovated visitor center that is also fully accessible. The park also has a sandy beach where visitors can swim and look for beach glass. This is a great place to visit in Ottawa County to see wildlife.
